

**Jesus Calls Together the Twelve**

**A**lmost everyone who has picked up a Bible has heard of the twelve tribes of Israel. Named after the twelve sons of the patriarch Jacob, the twelve tribes feature prominently in the Hebrew Scriptures. The twelve tribes are freed from slavery in Egypt and enter the Promised Land together. They then choose from among themselves a king. What would Vacation Bible School be without stories of the twelve tribes?

But read beyond the familiar lore of VBS, and one quickly discovers that the twelve tribes did not remain united. First, the tribes in the North were conquered by the Assyrians. Later, the tribes of the South were decimated by the Babylonians. The family once called by God to become a holy nation was scattered by war and the political machinations of their own leaders. They became like sheep without a shepherd, no longer a flock.

And that is where Jesus steps in, as we read in today's gospel. As he looks at his people—God's chosen family—he sees how wounded and lost they are; how polarized they have become. Jesus knows what he needs to do. He calls together the Twelve—a significant number. Jesus saw himself as reuniting his people after a season of painful separation from one another.

Today, Jesus continues to call people to participate in the ministry of reconciliation. Can you imagine your name included among the "twelve" as one who will help heal a divided nation? ●

# Dear Padre,

*I struggle to relate to traditional devotions like the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Any advice?*

Christ instructed his followers to love the Lord God with all our heart, soul, and mind. (See Matthew 22:37.) We seek a deeper union with God not only through reason and understanding but also through feelings and affections. However, as Pope Francis pointed out, "Many people feel safer...in the more readily controllable domain of intelligence and will" (*Dilexit Nos* [On the Human and Divine Love of the Heart of Jesus Christ], 10). Descartes said of us, "I think, therefore I am," but it can also be said that "I am my heart, for my heart is what sets me apart, shapes my spiritual identity, and puts me in communion with other people" (*DN* 14).

Moreover, the heart "is the place of encounter" with God (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2563). Pope Francis acknowledges that some people today may not find the Sacred Heart image to be meaningful (See *DN* 2.), but it's "a summons to make room for an encounter with Christ...in whatever way we wish to picture him" (*DN* 57). "More than any other part of his body, the heart of Jesus" represents "his boundless love" (*DN* 48). Therefore, "any act of love or worship of his heart is thus 'really and truly given to Christ himself,' since it spontaneously refers back to him and is 'a symbol and a tender image of the infinite love of Jesus Christ'" (*DN* 50). ●

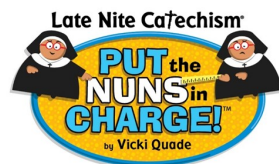

### SCHOOL PARENT FINANCIAL EXPECTATIONS

- Registration:** The registration fee is per student, per school year. If your child is removed and re-enrolled, a registration fee will be charged again.  
Early: on or before May 31st - \$125  
Regular: June 1st - July 31st - \$150  
Late: on or after August 1st - \$175
- Church Offering/Catholics Cost: Catholics** – Immaculate Conception School is a non-tuition school, because under the direction of the diocese, Bishop O’Donnell believes the education of the parish children is a mission of that parish. Therefore the children of the parish may attend the school because their parents are supporting the mission of the church by educating them (the child) in the ways of the faith. There is no tuition as long as the parents are **ACTIVE PARISH-IONERS. An active parishioner is a person who registered in the parish, regularly participates in Mass and the Sacraments, participates in the community life of the parish, and TITHES faithfully and justly to the church.** We hope that you **WILL** tithe justly and faithfully as we educate the children of our parish while supporting the mission of the parish.
- Non-Parishioner Cost: Non-Catholics** - \$4,100 for one child, \$5,450 for two children, and \$6,100 for three or more children.
- Technology Fee:** \$50.00 per child with a max of \$150 per family for the school year.
- Milk:** Milk for the school year will be charged at \$30 per child per semester or \$60 per child for the entire school year. Any extra milk will be \$0.35 per milk. **All** students are **required** to purchase milk unless a written doctor’s note states otherwise.
- Copy of Records:** Current Vaccination and copy of Birth Certificate for all new students, copy of Baptism and First Communion certificates for all new students or those recently baptized or communed. Copy of Divorce papers with custody statement for divorced parents.
- Extended Care Fees:** \$12 for the first child, \$10 for each additional child– 6:30-7:15 AM and 3:35-5:30 PM, fees include before and /or after school (or any part thereof).  
Example: 2 children = \$22 – 3 or more children = \$32.
  - \$17 per child on early out days, \$15 for each additional child:  
Example: 2 children = \$32, 3 children = \$47
  - \$34.50 per child for a full day.
  - All Students: If your child is in our care after 5:30 PM, you will be charged \$1 for every minute after 5:30PM.
