

**The Freedom of Letting Go of Secrets**

**S**ecrets. The disabling fear of discovery. Trying so hard to conceal something that we do not want others to know. Often, we guard secrets closely because we believe we will be embarrassed, punished, or excluded if our secrets are made known.

Sometimes, we hold tightly to secrets because we are ashamed. We keep other secrets because of the dynamics of family life: "We do not share our family business with anyone." All secrets can be difficult to keep—some more than others. Perhaps the most difficult secret to hold is one that we fear defines our personal integrity and authenticity. It is the fear not only of discovery but also of perception: How will I be perceived if this is made known? Will I still be accepted? Or, even more painful: Will I be rejected, and how complete will the rejection be?

The "good news" of the gospel is that "nothing is concealed that will not be revealed" (Matthew 10:26). In other words, there is nothing that can remain tucked away forever. Everything is revealed in one way or another. Gospel grace and freedom result when a person chooses to freely release whatever it is that burdens them, including closely held secrets. It is the ultimate experience of dying to self to claim eternal life. ●

# Dear Padre,

*For the past year or so, I have been trying to pray on a regular basis, but I am constantly distracted. My mind wanders so easily. Do you have any suggestions?*

Distractions in prayer are an inescapable part of the human condition and the results of our imagination. Even great saints experienced distractions in prayer. Some of their suggestions may help. For example, when St. Thérèse of Lisieux struggled with prayer, she would recite an Our Father or Hail Mary or read from the gospels. Praying as an act of faith or returning to God's presence and love can turn our focus away from other concerns, but, even then, distractions may still arise.

When we become aware of distractions, we should calmly renew our focus and continue our prayer. Saint Teresa of Ávila wrote in *The Interior Castle*, "We should not be distressed by reason of our thoughts, nor allow ourselves to be worried by them.... [Thoughts are] inevitable. Do not let [them] disturb or grieve you." No matter how often distractions return or how long they last, they are not sinful; rather, they are opportunities to show God that we are sincere about praying.

Saint Alphonsus, another great teacher of prayer, reminds us that prayer is necessary, beneficial, and always possible. He advises us to hang in there, because the devil would like nothing better than for us to stop praying. ●

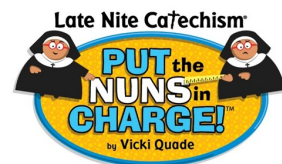

**SCHOOL PARENT FINANCIAL EXPECTATIONS**

1. **Registration:** The registration fee is per student, per school year. If your child is removed and re-enrolled, a registration fee will be charged again.  
Early: on or before May 31st - \$125  
Regular: June 1st - July 31st - \$150  
Late: on or after August 1st - \$175
2. **Church Offering/Catholics Cost: Catholics** – Immaculate Conception School is a non-tuition school, because under the direction of the diocese, Bishop O’Donnell believes the education of the parish children is a mission of that parish. Therefore the children of the parish may attend the school because their parents are supporting the mission of the church by educating them (the child) in the ways of the faith. There is no tuition as long as the parents are **ACTIVE PARISHIONERS. An active parishioner is a person who registered in the parish, regularly participates in Mass and the Sacraments, participates in the community life of the parish, and TITHES faithfully and justly to the church.** We hope that you **WILL** tithe justly and faithfully as we educate the children of our parish while supporting the mission of the parish.
3. **Non-Parishioner Cost: Non-Catholics** - \$4,100 for one child, \$5,450 for two children, and \$6,100 for three or more children.
4. **Technology Fee:** \$50.00 per child with a max of \$150 per family for the school year.
5. **Milk:** Milk for the school year will be charged at \$30 per child per semester or \$60 per child for the entire school year. Any extra milk will be \$0.35 per milk. **All** students are **required** to purchase milk unless a written doctor’s note states otherwise.
6. **Copy of Records:** Current Vaccination and copy of Birth Certificate for all new students, copy of Baptism and First Communion certificates for all new students or those recently baptized or communed. Copy of Divorce papers with custody statement for divorced parents.
7. **Extended Care Fees:** \$12 for the first child, \$10 for each additional child– 6:30-7:15 AM and 3:35-5:30 PM, fees include before and /or after school (or any part thereof).  
Example: 2 children = \$22 – 3 or more children = \$32.  
• \$17 per child on early out days, \$15 for each additional child:  
Example: 2 children = \$32, 3 children = \$47  
• \$34.50 per child for a full day.  
• All Students: If your child is in our care after 5:30 PM, you will be charged \$1 for every minute after 5:30PM.
