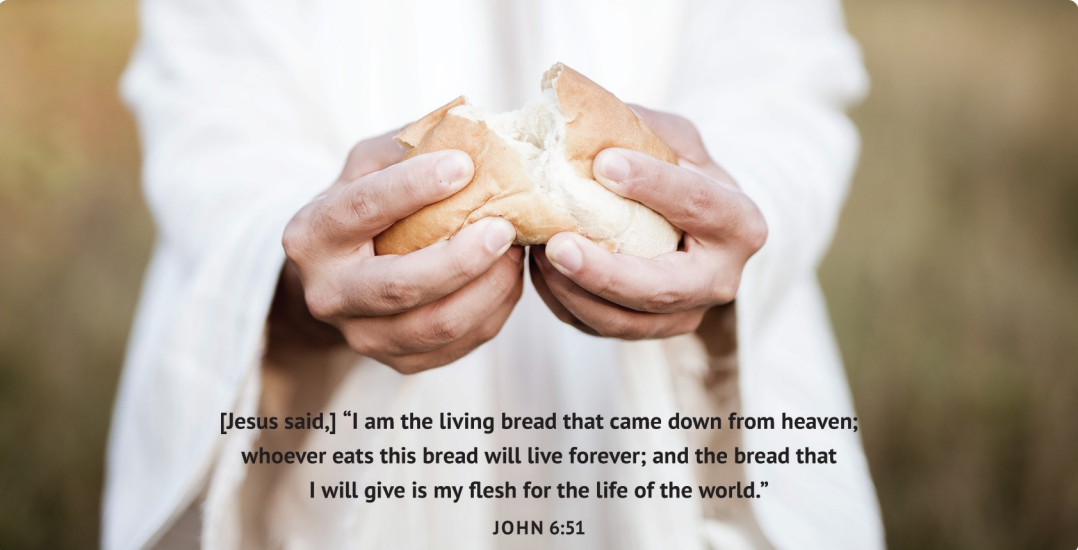

All You Can Eat

The "Bread of Life Discourse" in the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John is an astonishing teaching. "The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world" (John 6:51b). Creation was wonderful, the Incarnation was wonderful, but now Jesus takes the final step in God's coming ever closer to us human beings, as close as food, as intimate as eating Christ's body and drinking his blood. For us Catholics, it's called *transubstantiation*: the Host—something we hold in our hand—is so divine that we worship it!

The crowds listening to Jesus could not have imagined how you would "eat" (literally, "gnow") Jesus' flesh or drink his blood, and certainly not a whole year before the Last Supper (not to mention, hundreds of years before St. Thomas Aquinas). When surveys showed that many of today's Catholics are just as confused and doubtful as the crowd at Capernaum, having lost faith or even interest in the Eucharist, the American bishops launched a search-and-rescue mission to recover "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church," published in 2021.

Paul bases the sacrament in our own experience. "The cup...that we bless" and "the bread that we break" create the ultimate reality: "we, though many, are one body"—of Christ! (See 1 Corinthians 10:16–17) The priest says, "The Body of Christ," and we respond, "Amen!" ●

Dear Padre,

What is the significance of the Holy Eucharist in our lives as Christians?

The Mass should be understood as the celebration of our union—our communion—with Christ and his Church, which is the body of Christ. The Mass presumes participants have an existing personal relationship with Christ. We were united to Christ through baptism. We have received his Holy Spirit, empowering us to carry out Christ’s threefold mission: the prophetic mission of announcing his message and denouncing sin; the priestly mission expressed in a life of prayer, self-sacrifice, and participation in the liturgy; and the kingly/servant mission expressed in service to God and neighbor.

For the Eucharist to be meaningful, we must first experience a personal encounter with Christ—one that leads to personal conversion and a decision to live as disciples in community. Indeed, the Eucharist both celebrates and deepens our communion with Christ. The Eucharist also deepens our communion with fellow believers. “The Eucharist’s particular effectiveness in promoting communion is one of the reasons for the importance of Sunday Mass,” wrote Pope St. John Paul II in On the Eucharist in Its Relationship to the Church (*Ecclesia de Eucharistia*), 41. Without this loving, sharing community, the Mass becomes empty. Whenever we attend Mass and receive holy Communion, we should ask ourselves: *Are we really in communion with Jesus and the body of Christ, his Christian community?* If not, then we should seek this broader communion in our lives. ●

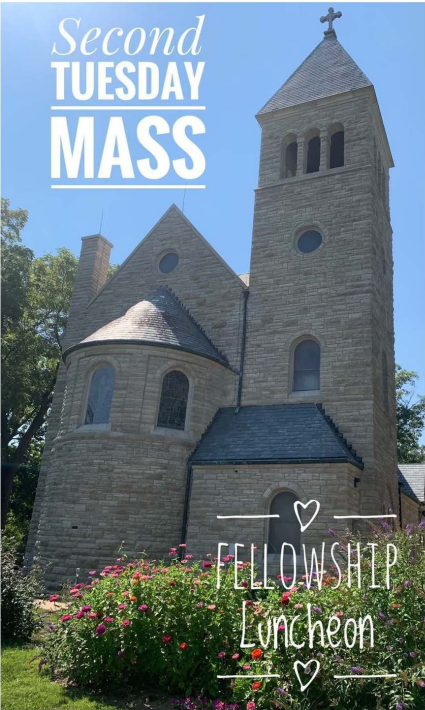

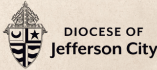

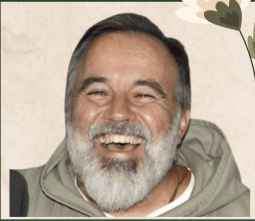

SCHOOL PARENT FINANCIAL EXPECTATIONS	
1. Registration: The registration fee is per student, per school year. If your child is removed and re-enrolled, a registration fee will be charged again. Early: on or before May 31st - \$125 Regular: June 1st - July 31st - \$150 Late: on or after August 1st - \$175	
2. Church Offering/Catholics Cost: Catholics – Immaculate Conception School is a non-tuition school, because under the direction of the diocese, Bishop O'Donnell believes the education of the parish children is a mission of that parish. Therefore the children of the parish may attend the school because their parents are supporting the mission of the church by educating them (the child) in the ways of the faith. There is no tuition as long as the parents are ACTIVE PARISH-IONERS. An active parishioner is a person who registered in the parish, regularly participates in Mass and the Sacraments, participates in the community life of the parish, and TITHES faithfully and justly to the church. We hope that you WILL tithe justly and faithfully as we educate the children of our parish while supporting the mission of the parish.	
3. Non-Parishioner Cost: Non-Catholics - \$4,100 for one child, \$5,450 for two children, and \$6,100 for three or more children.	
4. Technology Fee: \$50.00 per child with a max of \$150 per family for the school year.	
5. Milk: Milk for the school year will be charged at \$30 per child per semester or \$60 per child for the entire school year. Any extra milk will be \$0.35 per milk. All students are required to purchase milk unless a written doctor's note states otherwise.	
6. Copy of Records: Current Vaccination and copy of Birth Certificate for all new students, copy of Baptism and First Communion certificates for all new students or those recently baptized or communed. Copy of Divorce papers with custody statement for divorced parents.
