Today's gospel passage is challenging. If anyone other than Jesus told you that if you love your own family “more than me,” you are “not worthy of me,” you would laugh in their face! Or, is this what scholars call a “semitism”—a culturally conditioned exaggeration used for effect? What about you are “not worthy of me” unless you “take up [your] cross and follow me,” or “whoever finds his life will lose it”? Does Jesus mean these literally, or are these metaphors? And what is “a prophet’s reward”?

A friend of mine tried an experiment. He took the Gospel of Matthew and read it through from start to finish as if he had never seen it before. He was astonished! Jesus was serious. He meant it—all of it. Try it yourself without looking for loopholes.

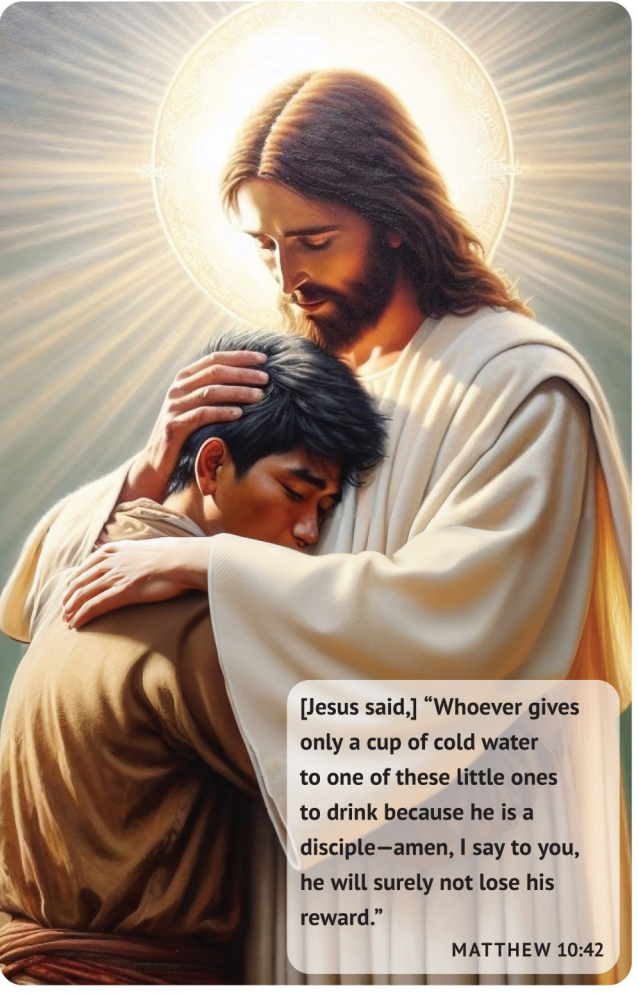
The key in the reading today is “for my sake.” The standard, the rule, that absolute mark is “me,” that is, Jesus himself, only Jesus, always Jesus. And Jesus sets that mark very high. Take up your cross? Jesus was abandoned on the cross. Jesus gave away his Mother from the cross. Jesus lost his life on the cross. But he found that life: resurrection! That is “a prophet’s reward,” is it not?

I have to love Jesus’ promise, a special “reward” for just sharing “a cup of cold water” with a “little one.” It reminds me of Honduras, where I live. Here, a cup of cold water can make the difference between life and death. And that is no exaggeration! ●

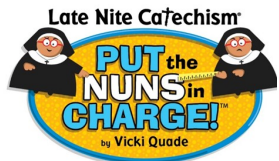

1. **Registration:** The registration fee is per student, per school year. If your child is removed and re-enrolled, a registration fee will be charged again.
 - Early: on or before May 31st - \$125
 - Regular: June 1st - July 31st - \$150
 - Late: on or after August 1st - \$175
2. **Church Offering/Catholics Cost: Catholics** – Immaculate Conception School is a non-tuition school, because under the direction of the diocese, Bishop O'Donnell believes the education of the parish children is a mission of that parish. Therefore the children of the parish may attend the school because their parents are supporting the mission of the church by educating them (the child) in the ways of the faith. There is no tuition as long as the parents are **ACTIVE PARISH-IONERS**. *An active parishioner is a person who registered in the parish, regularly participates in Mass and the Sacraments, participates in the community life of the parish, and TITHES faithfully and justly to the church.* We hope that you **WILL** tithe justly and faithfully as we educate the children of our parish while supporting the mission of the parish.
3. **Non-Parishioner Cost: Non-Catholics** - \$4,100 for one child, \$5,450 for two children, and \$6,100 for three or more children.
4. **Technology Fee:** \$50.00 per child with a max of \$150 per family for the school year.
5. **Milk:** Milk for the school year will be charged at \$30 per child per semester or \$60 per child for the entire school year. Any extra milk will be \$0.35 per milk. *All* students are **required** to purchase milk unless a written doctor's note states otherwise.
6. **Copy of Records:** Current Vaccination and copy of Birth Certificate for all new students, copy of Baptism and First Communion certificates for all new students or those recently baptized or communed. Copy of Divorce papers with custody statement for divorced parents.
7. **Extended Care Fees:** \$12 for the first child, \$10 for each additional child– 6:30-7:15 AM and 3:35-5:30 PM, fees include before and/or after school (or any part thereof).
 - Example: 2 children = \$22 – 3 or more children = \$32.
 - \$17 per child on early out days, \$15 for each additional child:
 - Example: 2 children = \$32, 3 children = \$47
 - \$34.50 per child for a full day.
 - All Students: If your child is in our care after 5:30 PM, you will be charged \$1 for every minute after 5:30PM.
